# Compassionate Conversations - new accredited educational programme

The Compassionate Conversations programme is designed to support you to hold compassionate conversations in your practice, with the goal of creating a sense of trust and emotional connection, ensuring patients feel valued and understood, especially during challenging times.



#### About this programme

Study this online programme to understand the guiding principles of holding compassionate conversations, to evaluate own practice and support others to hold compassionate conversations.

The programme consists of 3 days of taught online sessions plus additional self-directed learning and an assessment. Successful completion of the unit will gain you 4 credits at Level 3, accredited by Agored Cymru.

#### Learning Outcomes

- Understand compassionate conversations
- Know how to adopt compassionate conversations in own role
- Be able to hold compassionate conversations
- Be able to support others to hold compassionate conversations.

#### Who is this programme suitable for?

On successful completion of the programme you will gain 4 credits at Level 3. This programme is open to staff across health and social care. RCN membership is not essential. NMC registration is not a requirement of enrolment on this programme.

This unit will be delivered online, over three days, one day per week for three weeks, on the following dates:

- Day 1 Wednesday 9 July 2025, 9.15am 4.15pm
- Day 2 Wednesday 16 July 2025, 9.15am 4.15pm
- Day 3 Wednesday 23 July 2025, 9.15am 4.15pm

There will also be additional self-directed learning and an assessment. There is 40 hours learning time for this unit in total.

# Celebrating Learning Disability Nursing in Wales newly published report

People with a learning disability in Wales live, on average, 20 years less than the general population – a stark indicator of the health inequalities they face. Learning disability nurses play a vital role in addressing these disparities. Yet there are significant challenges in understanding how many are needed in Wales, as well as in recruiting and retaining them.

This report explores the challenges and sets out five key recommendations for the Welsh Government to ensure there are enough skilled professionals to meet the needs of people with a learning disability across Wales.

# The use of Hazardous Medicinal Products

**RCN Position Statement: The use of Hazardous Medicinal Products** As nursing staff are at risk of exposure to hazardous medicinal products, the RCN wants to see positive action being taken to protect health care workers now and in the future. This position statement outlines the key risks to nurses and highlights the current issues.

# Working with Dogs in Health Care Settings

This updated guidance highlights the precautions that should be taken when dogs are brought into various health care settings and provides clear guidance on all reasonable safeguards that should be put in place to protect patients or residents, visitors and staff. It covers the role of both the dog and the owner/handler and includes information that all organisations should take into account before allowing a dog to access their premises. This includes staff with assistance dogs as well as patients, visitors, and people and organisations who have contact or who work with assistance dogs or therapy dogs.
